

From the Desk of the Pastor

Easter, 2021

Dear Friends in Christ,

These past three days we walked with the Lord Jesus as he went up to Jerusalem to suffer and die for us. This Easter morning, we heard St. Mark's Gospel, and we went with Mary Magdalene and the other Mary, wondering who might roll away the stone sealing Jesus in the tomb. Instead, they found the stone already rolled back, and they encounter a young man robed in white who tells them:

“Do not be amazed!
You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified.
He has been raised; he is not here.
Behold the place where they laid him.
But go and tell his disciples and Peter,
'He is going before you to Galilee;
there you will see him, as he told you.'”

Because of this event, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary, along with the other disciples, became urgent and insistent messengers of the resurrection and hope offered by the Lord Jesus. As Pope Francis put it in his Easter Vigil homily last year:

“... Jesus emerged (from the grave) for us; he rose for us, to bring life where there was death, to begin a new story in the very place where a stone had been placed. He, who rolled away the stone that sealed the entrance of the tomb, can also remove the stones in our hearts... He did not abandon us; he visited us and entered into our situations of pain, anguish and death. His light dispelled the darkness of the tomb; today he wants that light to penetrate even to the darkest corners of our lives. God is greater. Darkness and death do not have the last word.”

Resurrection impels us to put Christ first and be eager messengers this good news!

With all that has gone on in our world in the past year, it is all the more important that we be witnesses to the resurrection, witnesses to the goodness of God, and witnesses to hope! I want to ask you as you go forth today, to share your faith, to let it transform and reorder your priorities, to let it change your life. The resurrection of Christ changed the world. It has changed us. It is good news too joyous to keep inside. Live it! Share it!




LIGHT OF EASTER MORNING


