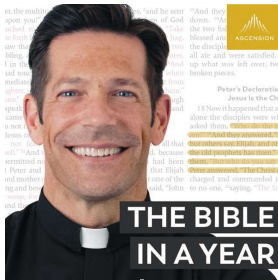

Danielle M. Brown, Esq., has traveled the US speaking about the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) Letter "Open Wide Our Hearts: The Enduring Call to Love". She will get to the heart of the matter with an overview of the USCCB national letter and unpack the many ways we can spread the call to discipleship and celebrate the dignity of each person.

Danielle M. Brown, Esq., is a lawyer licensed in Michigan and a former Michigan Supreme Court appointed Commissioner for the State Bar's Board of Commissioners. Before joining the USCCB in May 2018, she served on several boards, committees, and initiatives. She was a special delegate to the USCCB Convocation of Catholic Bishops and the National Black Catholic Congress in 2017. Before joining the conference, she was a three-time governor appointed appellate administrative law judge in unemployment and workers compensation for the State of Michigan as well as an administrative law judge and an assistant deputy legal counsel to the Governor of the State of Michigan.
