***\*Please note: We cannot take walk-ins at Sunday Masses, please register!***

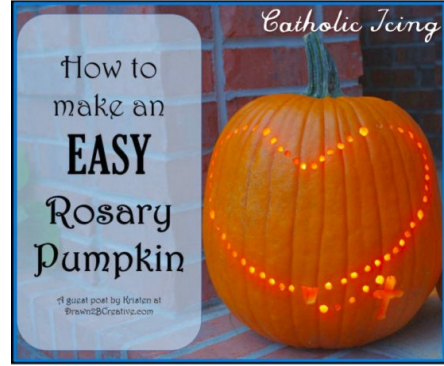
